How would you like to participate in an online book study? You not only have an opportunity to participate with others, but you also have the opportunity to engage with the author in the last session!!





Grocery Donations

Mobile Pantry will be the recipient of our grocery donations during the month of August. Mobile Pantry delivers groceries to people who live in rural Portage County and who don't have reliable transportation to get to town. Most of them are elderly.

Requests for this month include paper products such as paper towels, toilet paper and tissues, as well as personal care items like shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, and body wash. They are also in need of dish soap, laundry detergent and other cleaning agents like Mr. Clean.

Notice that the above list doesn't contain any food items. Living on a limited budget means that the recipients of the groceries often have to do without nonfood items. Plus, the Pantry doesn't usually get enough nonfood items donated to supply everyone on their delivery list. So let's fill the grocery cart with all sorts of nonfood items this month (or make a cash donation in the little blue box on the counter in the narthex). Thank you!

Spare-A-Dime

The August Spare-A-Dime collection will be dedicated to the ELCA Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS). The ELCA has a long history of caring for children, families, and refugees. It's who we are. Recently, Bishop Eaton reminded us that our Lord has cared for refugees throughout the ages:



Abraham and Sarah; Jacob and his family who moved to Egypt during the famine; the population of Israel when they departed Egypt to escape slavery; and the Holy Family when they were threatened with violence and infanticide.

The LIRS provides service and advocates for the most vulnerable—refugees who are displaced by violence and persecution. Today's global refugee crisis affects nearly 65 million people. Fortunately, LIRS has a robust network of service partners, volunteers and churches to help integrate refugees and assist with their stabilization.

ELCA World Hunger Life-Changing Events

Our youth just returned from a life changing event in Houston. ELCA World Hunger helps to change the lives of people living in hunger and poverty in 60 countries around the world, including the U.S. Here are some ways that this is happening:

Income: Farmers in Indonesia were growing bananas on their farms. But the income wasn't enough to support their families. Through ELCA World Hunger they received a loan and technical support to grow chilis. Because they grow quickly, chilis can be harvested several times a year. Now these farmers have enough food to feed their families and provide for education for their children.

Agriculture: Many farmers in the developing world are subsistence farmers – growing just enough food to feed their families. If a crop fails these farmers might not have savings or income to buy food for themselves. With access to the right tools, seeds and clean water, as well as organizing and training that can ensure a fair price for their crops, families can sell some of their crops and have enough money for food, school, and other necessities throughout the year.

Education: When children can attend school, they can secure better opportunities for their future. Programs like literacy training and vocational education also help teens and adults get jobs and increase their earning potential.

Leaders: ELCA World Hunger is pleased to walk alongside ELCA Congregations and individuals who are working toward a just world where all are fed. An example is God's Garden of Grace, a community garden started by St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Plainfield, NJ, to provide fresh food to their local food banks.

Trinity Quilt Makers

<u>LWR Quilters</u> is a Facebook site that many of us contribute to and many of us benefit from. One of our ladies got an idea from the site and made a beautiful quilt top, very different from those we typically make. It truly is a sharing site and hundreds of ladies get great ideas from it.

Lots of people ask us, "Where do these quilts and kits get sent?" In 2017 the items we make go through the St. Paul warehouse and get shipped to Africa. They go to Mauritania, Burkina Faso, Niger, Angola, Tanzania, South Sudan and Djibouti. In the past 25 years, United States Lutherans have made an estimated: 8.8 million Mission Quilts; 3.3 Million School Kits; 1.5 Million Baby Care Kits and 2.9 Million Person Care kits.

It seems you can't go very far this summer without seeing a Rummage Sale sign. If your car stops at all Rummage Sales, be on the lookout for baby T-shirts and Sleepers, size 6-24 months. If you find these items you can leave them on the counter by the elevator. And if you find sheets in good condition we can use them too. Your donations are greatly appreciated.
