

#### PASTOR CLAY'S COLUMN

#### **Thanks for your Feedback**

Dear Trinity Friends,

As most of you know, we have a weekly Connection Card in the bulletin. It is used in a number of ways. Our denomination asks us to keep track of communion records, which is why we ask you to indicate when you are communing on the card. It tells us if there are guests among us, and whether they are from the university. It also tells us if we have people interested in membership at Trinity. People also use them to leave notes for us in the church office.

I like to get feedback about our worship services, and I want everyone to know that we take that feedback into consideration as we plan for future worship times. One of the recent comments was that the some of our services have been too long. When Heidi, Matt, Katie, and I plan each service, we do take into account how much is going on in each service and try to omit or shorten things where we can. This fall we have had a large number of extra things creep into our worship time, such as dedications of new gifts (piano, sign, St. John's Bible, etc.) and quite a number of Temple Talks. I have to agree that these things extend the time of worship and that is especially hard on young families. One of the things entirely in my control is the length of sermons. Every once in a while, I do succeed in keeping the message short. Please keep providing your feedback and we will do what we can to accommodate your suggestions.

Sometimes, the feedback we get is divided. Some people will like an element of worship. Others will dislike it. We do listen and try to be thoughtful when we have contradictory suggestions.

Regarding worship feedback, we have some questions that come up occasionally and we have decided to spend some of our Middle Hour time in December thinking together about a few of the issues. Here are a couple subjects we hope to discuss early in December.

December 2: The state of worship in America and whether Trinity should introduce a midweek worship service.

December 9: Issues relating to serving communion and questions about safety and security during worship. Officer Kristi Ahrens will help us address these things.

These conversations will be held in the sanctuary after the Sunday School children have finished their opening. That gives us all time to grab some coffee and a treat.

Please join us for these upcoming conversations, and please keep providing feedback. Also, please note that when you provide your name along with a suggestion, that is helpful. It allows us to know whom to speak to if we want more information about things you are concerned about.

Thanks for communicating with us in the church office through the Connection Card.

#### Dear friends,

Youth under the age of 30 make up some 70% of the population in Southern Africa and face many challenges related to education, unemployment, gender justice, health and climate change. So, are youth pessimistic or optimistic, afraid or hopeful about the future?

Seven young adults representing several member churches of the Lutheran Communion in Southern Africa (LUCSA) met recently at the Lutheran center in Johannesburg to start planning for an all LUCSA youth conference in 2019. (LUCSA, with fifteen member churches across ten countries in Southern Africa, is a sub-regional expression of the Lutheran World Federation (LWF))



The youth unanimously and energetically agreed to work with the LWF theme for 2019-2024 "With passion for the Church and the World."

The committee worked on a draft program that will include reports on youth activities from member churches, as well as Bible studies, presentations and discussions. The conference will focus on what it means to be "Young Reformers" working for revival in the church, Lutheran identity, diakonia, gender justice and care for creation. The LUCSA INFOHUT program which teaches computer skills and life skills including information about HIV & AIDS will be a key part of the program.

The LUCSA youth are enthusiastic and committed to establishing a Youth Desk in the Communion Office, to building strong relationships between youth in the member churches and making a lasting difference in their respective churches and in the region.



#### **Before the Church Office Opens:**


