A P P L Y	Day 6 - Proverbs 31: 8-9*Sunday readings in bold.The words from Luke-the pronouncement Jesus gives to those gathered in the synagogue in this Sunday's Gospel speak of God's plan and Jesus' role in it. He outlines his "agenda" and we see him living it out every day that follows. Today in this country, our response to the poor, those living in captivity or under oppressive conditions is varied or often deeply divided, sometimes even along political lines. Yet Christ did not come to save us individually, apart from one another. How might we better live into Jesus's words with our own lives, taking action and speaking out about the things that were important to him in his earthly ministry?
