Loose Change— SPARE-A-Dime

Every day, JusticeWorks promotes forms of justice that strengthen our community and supports individuals and families who are confronting issues with the legal system. So far this year hundreds of individuals have turned to the services at our Family Law Information Center to prepare for family court proceedings, and our trained staff has provided hundreds of hours of professional



mentoring to high-risk offenders who are preparing to rejoin our community in the Community Residential Program. Our Shifting Gears program not only gives opportunities for job skill training and required community service hours, but helps individuals purchase a reliable and affordable means of transportation. They work with groups and individuals including participants of the Boys and Girls Club and the Portage County Literacy Council. In addition, we are relaunching our VIP program where we match community volunteers with someone, who if they complete our program, have their record wiped clean.

Each year we grant the John Klismet award to a Community Volunteer that in some way does what they can to promote justice in their service to the Community. This is awarded at the Martin Luther King Day Celebration which will be held on MLK Day, January 20, 2020.
