

PASTOR CLAY'S COLUMN

Dear Trinity Friends,

How beautiful it was to see so many people in worship over the holidays. The music was splendid and there was joy in the air. We sometimes lament that more people don't come to worship regularly during the rest of the year, rather than being part of what a priest friend refers to as the Lily and Poinsettia Crowd. Still, I am very grateful that so many do come, even if only a few times per year.

The reasons for declining attendance across the nation are many. I have come to realize that the 200 or so that come to worship each week are representative of at least 600 people whom we now call "regular" worshipers. Folks just take turns being here while life continues to pull them in many other directions. We had first communion on December 22. When we were trying to select a date that worked for everyone, one of the mom's looked at her calendar with hope. Then she said, "Well, we have hockey that day—but I think we could skip that for first communion." I rejoiced—and I declared: "Wow, that is one Sunday when church wins out over hockey!"

Thanks to all who provided special music and decorations for our Christmas season. These wonderful people continue doing their good work, leading and assisting with worship all year around. We can count on them to be here whenever you are able to be with us. I pray that worship may win out a little more often over sports and other

things. But, know that whenever we gather, Christ is with us and the time together is sacred and blessed. Happy New Year!

ANNUAL MEETING

Last fall, the we announced that we were going to try some experiments relating to worship. Here is what we discovered.

Experiment with shortening the 10:45 a.m. Sunday service: This did not work out well. The only way to keep the service to 45 minutes, we found, was if we omitted Holy Communion regularly. We did choose fewer hymn stanzas and made some other adjustments, but in the end, that did not save much time. The closest we came was about 50 minutes a time or two. From now on, we will continue to streamline things where possible, but we won't try to continue to aim for a 45 minute service.

Experiment with a Wednesday night 5:45 service: This has worked out very well. We have had a quite regular group of people coming on Wednesdays. It is usually between 12 and 24 people. And, they are people of all ages, including youth and infants. It appears that having this option for people is very attractive, which means that we will happily continue the service.

Experiment with a Wednesday educational opportunity: We have tried this because we have been attempting to "take back Wednesdays." Since the fall, we have been offering a study group called Exploring our Faith. To date, we have looked at Exploring our Neighbor's Faith, Exploring Hard Questions about our Faith, and a number of other interesting topics. We have had a regular attendance of 8-10 people for these discussion and intend to continue them, beginning on January 15.

The nice thing about experiments is that whether they fail or succeed, you always learn something important. We are glad to have tried these worship and education experiments and have learned how important it is for people to have alternative times for worship and devotion. Come check out our Wednesday offerings, perhaps at least on the 3rd Wednesday of the month when we also have a congregational potluck (at 5:00 p.m.). The service is completely different from Sunday, so you won't hear or sing the same things as the past Sunday. Thank you.






donation will go to the Stevens Point Warming Center.

In early November a five-day training of trainers (TOT) workshop in conflict resolution and peace building was held at the Lutheran Center in Johannesburg, South Africa. The workshop was a joint venture between the Lutheran Communion in Southern Africa (LUCSA) with 15 member churches in ten countries and expert trainers from the Ecumenical Church Leaders' Forum (ECLF) based in Zimbabwe.

Member churches were invited to each send two representatives. Interactive sessions included demystifying conflict, tools for analysing the manifestations and root causes of conflict, active listening and effective communication skills, understanding power, dialogue, mediation, the importance of inner healing and the nexus between peace and development. Daily sessions opened and closed with devotions. The LUCSA / ECLF training manual *Paths to Peace* was officially launched on Friday Nov. 8.



Many participants indicated that the "healing" session was one of the most important and transforming experiences at the workshop and acknowledged that further training would be helpful for them to be effective trainers of trainers.

As the ELCA we are seeking to be a visible church deeply committed to working ecumenically and with other people of faith for justice, peace and reconciliation in our communities and around the world. (Goal Four of the ELCA's Strategic Directions 2025 document CALLED FORWARD TOGETHER IN CHRIST).

ELCA - Global Mission through Diakonia/World Hunger Funding is therefore supporting the collaborative work of LUCSA and ECLF in providing training and the sharing of resources in the region and on the African continent to promote conflict resolution and peacebuilding programs.

IN ETHIOPIA, FAMILIES IN DESPERATE NEED WELCOME QUILTS AND CARE KITS

Can you imagine having nothing? This is the reality for families in Ethiopia who have had to flee from their homes to escape

ethnic conflict with only the safety of their children as their sole concern. At the Kera refugee camp in Ethiopia—now home to 5,000 people—the need is extraordinary.

Women there express their deep and heartfelt gratitude for quilts that help the children stay warm and the items in the Personal Care Kits help to keep families clean. Families are so appreciative that they treat the quilts reverently, refusing to put them on the ground. Because we make the quilts by hand, putting love and care into each stitch, these people see the quilts as a personal gift and treat them as such.

The quilts and care kits have helped to ease the suffering of misplaced persons. LWR says, "Thank you for comforting families in their times of greatest need."

Our quilting days in January are Tuesday, January 14th and Thursday, January 23rd. We begin at 9 a.m., break for tea/coffee and treats at 10:30 a.m., have lunch at 12:30 p.m. and work until 3:00 p.m. You can come for the whole day or for as long as you'd like. If you are adding something new to your volunteer list for the New Year, consider joining us for quilting.





Make this craft to remember God's

What you need:

- Small stones
- Permanent markers
- Foil pan and cooking spray
- Drop cloth
- Gloves
- Quick-set concrete (and adult help)
- Bucket and paint stirrer

What you do:

- 1. After reflecting on the past year, use markers to decorate stones with memorable words, dates and drawings.
- 2. Spray pan with cooking spray. Set pan outside on a drop cloth.
- 3. Wearing gloves, mix concrete in a bucket, according to instructions.
- 4. Pour concrete into pan. Smooth top with paint stirrer.
- 5. Press in stones, handprints and other decorations.
- 6. Let dry completely. Remove from pan.
- 7. Place the stepping-stone outside as a reminder of God's continued goodness.
