

Interfaith Food Pantry in Plover will be the recipient of our cash donations for groceries during the month of July. IFP gives out groceries on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month to approximately 350 families. The number of people asking for help has stayed the same or gone down a bit. About half of the people getting food are seniors.

The needs of the IFP are changing to reflect the kinds of donations made by government programs and the public. For instance, in those hot days in June, more cash was needed to pay for utilities. The amount of milk provided by government programs is decreasing, so cash donations will be used to buy milk and other dairy products.

BACK TO SCHOOL

Let us help children in Portage County through Project Fresh Start and around the world through LWR. The following school supplies are needed.

Project Fresh Start Items -durable backpacks for older grades -washable markers -dry erase markers -highlighters -colored pencils -3x5" index cards rulers -adult scissors -sharpeners -pencil boxes -glue bottles & sticks -composition notebooks -single subject notebooks (wide & college ruled) -two pocket folders **This collection runs until August 15, 2021.**

LWR School Kit Items -24 crayons -ruler with centimeters & inches -pencil sharpener -blunt scissors -No. 2 pencils -Blue or black pens -2 1/2" eraser - notebooks (wide or college ruled) *These are greatly needed as 4 notebooks go on one school kit. This collection will continue after August 15, 2021.
