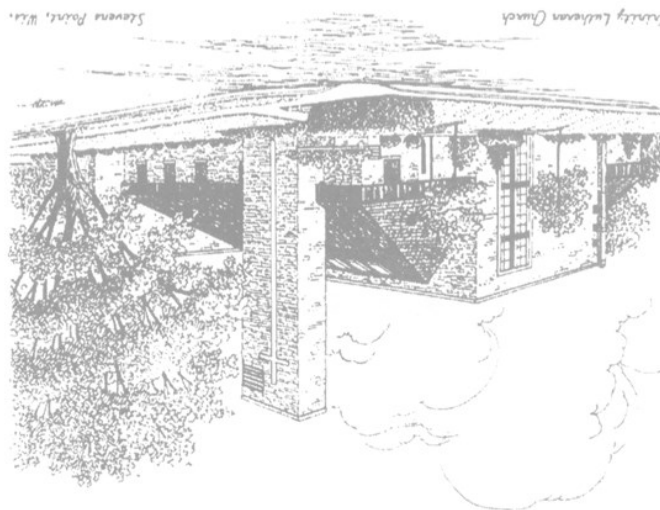

I feel personally blessed by the amazing patience that our members have shown during this period.

Now that we are holding two worship services indoors, people are slowly finding their way back. When I look out at the gathering crowd in the sanctuary, it makes my heart leap with joy. I know that many are still being cautious, viewing our services online or on TV. Thank God we are able to keep providing them worship opportunities in this way.

Today, as we approach Thanksgiving, I want to express my gratitude for a number of people who have kept us going over this long haul. I begin with Amy and the Learning Center staff. They have been open throughout, and in the past year and a half, have only shut down a couple times. Their faithfulness has been an inspiration—and a critical asset to the parents they serve. Thanks, Amy and team.

Our office staff has kept up with all the work, while trying to do much of it from home. Now we are nearly back to normal. Tammy and Doris remain a joy to work with. Even in spite of some illness and the long period of isolation, they have kept a smile on their faces and a desire to serve in their hearts. Thanks, Doris and Tammy.

Our highly skilled custodian, Glen, has taken the opportunity to do a lot of extra building maintenance while we were shut down. He attended to things that ordinarily are hard to get to during regular building traffic. He has worked closely with Gail Pucci, chair of our Buildings and Grounds committee, attending to various things both inside and outside the building. As you enter for worship,

you will see signs of their activity. Thanks, Glen, Gail, and the B and G team for keeping things up so faithfully.

The worship and music staff have been busier than ever during these uncertain days. I have been blessed to work beside them in planning and offering worship services on Sundays and Wednesdays. They have undertaken all of this challenging work with joy and dedication. Thanks, Heidi, Katie, and Matt for your devotion.

Todd Lewis has not stopped in his earnest desire to provide ministry to our youth, their families, and our Sunday School age children. This has been especially hard because these are the ones who are not yet vaccinated. Some of our youth have been; others have chosen not to be, which makes it extremely difficult to hold youth events. Let us pray that things will settle down so that the plans for next summer's Youth Gathering in Minneapolis will allow for our kids to participate safely. Thanks, Todd, for your unfailing commitment to our kids and families.

Finally, a word of thanks to you all for your patience, your unstoppable service in making quilts, serving food to the hungry in our community, providing rides, serving the homeless, visiting those in jail and those who are isolated, donating food and materials for many good causes, caring for our library, supporting the Nicaragua project, and making yourselves open to the refugees that are coming to our area. Even during the pandemic, it was a joy to behold how the members of Trinity have lived out our mission of worship, witness, and service. Thank you and God bless you all.

### Loose Change for November: Afghan Refugees – Lutheran Social Services

The crisis in Afghanistan has resulted in hundreds of thousands of individuals fleeing their country. While the numbers are ever evolving, it is estimated that up to 18,000 Afghan refugees will pass through Fort McCoy as they enter into a resettlement program. Our congregation did a marvelous job of responding to the appeal for needed winter items for the refugees at Fort McCoy. THANK YOU to all who donated. As we wait for more news about how we can help with the refugees that are being temporarily housed at Fort McCoy, there is still a way to be of assistance.



Lutheran Social Services of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan is just one of many agencies committing assistance to helping the needs of our immigrants. As the Wisconsin affiliate of the Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service, LSS provides comprehensive resettlement services to refugees fleeing from war and persecution around the globe. The November Loose Change will be directed to LSS to aid this organization in attending to immediate needs. Cash donations are critical as this can help families purchase the simplest of needs, such as personal care items and shoes and clothing. Most of the refugees fled their country with only the clothes they were wearing.

Their priority is to give out the most nutritious foods possible. This month our cash donations will go to purchase milk for each family. This is an expenditure of \$400 - \$500. They will also try to give each family a dozen eggs.

Our library offers several new books for your reading pleasure. The following titles include a wide variety of choices.

Hidden Valley Road by Robert Kolker (616.89 Kol) tells the true story of a family of twelve children. Six have been diagnosed with schizophrenia, offering scientists the ability to study the genetics of the disease. It is a powerful story of people struggling with the disease and the people supporting them.

The Vanishing Half by Brit Bennett (F Ben) shares the story of twin sisters choosing two different paths. One stays in her southern black hometown, the other, with lighter skin, passes herself off as white and moves hundreds of miles away. Eventually, their daughters' lives also intertwine in a story dealing with race, gender, and influences of the past.

Transcription by Kate Atkinson (F Atk) is a novel that takes an eighteen-year-old woman recruited into 1940 espionage through her work in BBC radio when her past catches up with her.

Saints, Signs, and Symbols by Hilarie and James Cornwell (246 Cor) is a reference tool using illustrations and explanations of the symbolic language of Christian art.

Consider the Women by Debbie Blue (220.92 Blu) brings to life the struggles, joys, and faith of three matriarchs of the Bible, Hagar, Esther, and Mary.

The Last Chance Library by Freya Sampson (F Sam) is the story of a small town library, its librarians, and some eccentric locals that think of it as their safe space. This is their fight to save their library from being replaced by a bookmobile by an unscrupulous town council looking for ways to save money.

From our primary shelves:

The Camping Trip by Jennifer Mann (Pri Man) takes Ernestine from her comfort zone to the outdoors, opening her mind to new experiences and challenges.

Breathe by Scott Magoon (Pri Mag) follows a little whale on his underwater adventures.



I Love My Busy Book by Cyndy Szekeres (Pri Sze) follows Little Mouse on his busy day through the A,B,C's, 1,2,3's, colors, opposites, shapes, animal sounds, and feelings.

- Families displaced by conflict in Armenia
- Street children at risk of being drawn into gangs in Honduras
- Struggling school children in the Democratic Republic of Congo
- Impoverished families in South Sudan

Everything is coming together as we get Quilts, Baby Care Kits, School Kits and Personal Care Kits ready for shipment. Thank you to everyone who has contributed to these projects for Lutheran World Relief.

Work days in November are Tuesday, November 9 and Thursday, November 18. LWR Quilts are highly regarded throughout the world because of their quality and consistency. Join us in the Chapel Area as we work together making quilts that bring comfort to the less fortunate.

## HEROES FOR YOUTH

Portage County Health and Human Services is looking for treatment foster homes, which are affectionately named HEROES Homes. HEROES Homes allow high-needs youth to stay in our community, continue to attend the same school, and receive intensive in-home services so family reunification can happen sooner.

Youth placed in HEROES Homes will have significant behavioral and/or mental health needs. However, these are also youth who need a hero on their side; someone who will not give up on them. Research shows that youth who have ONE caring adult in their lives have a greater chance of success than their peers who don't. Our HEROES Home foster parents receive extensive training prior to placement, take part in monthly team meetings, receive daily contact from their social worker to help them adjust to the needs of the youth, and receive respite care.

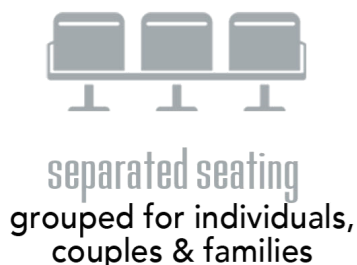
