

Happy New Year

The church's year begins anew with the first Sunday in Advent. This year, that fell upon November 28. Our denomination operates (as most lectionary based churches do) on a three year cycle based on the Gospels. We are now in the third year of the cycle which means that our Gospel readings will be from Luke.

To celebrate Advent this year, we are holding Wednesday evening services at 7:30 pm, using a favorite resource, the Holden Evening Prayer service. These are live services and we hope that you will join us as we anticipate the coming of Christmas together.

While we are still in a cautious mode regarding worship services, we do want to provide many opportunities for live worship this Christmas. We are holding four Christmas Eve services: 3 p.m., 5 p.m., 7 p.m., and 9 p.m. The first two services will be oriented toward families with children. We look forward to being together again this Christmas, celebrating Christ's birth in a more or less usual way. For those desiring to tune in for worship online, the 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. services will each be broadcast on Facebook live and on our website (through YouTube).

Because Christmas falls on a Saturday this year, we will also be having live worship services on Saturday morning at 10:45 a.m., as well as our regular Sunday service on the 26th at 10:45. With plenty of opportunity for live worship, I hope you will join us as we celebrate this season.

Loose Change for December 2021: The UWSP Cupboard

Thousands of UWSP students receive need-based financial aid. Many of these students are enrolled in local food assistance and WIC programs. As life is unpredictable, students encounter short-term financial emergencies and find themselves choosing between buying food and paying other bills. The UWSP Cupboard was created to help students temporarily meet their basic needs, so that they can focus on succeeding in school. The December Loose Change collection will be dedicated to The Cupboard.

The Cupboard provides food and personal hygiene items through a supervised and well-managed pantry in the Dreyfus University Center on the UW-Stevens Point campus. Any registered student can access the services by walking in or completing an online form. The Cupboard is staffed by student volunteers, who not only sort and stock items, but also prepare bags of groceries for pick up.

Your loose change will be collected and made available to The Cupboard to purchase perishable items, high nutrient foods, and high-demand items missing from the inventory. Thank you for your generosity!

This past week I attended and presented at the annual Lutheran Communion in Southern Africa (LUCSA) regional youth peer educators' review and planning workshop held in Johannesburg at the Lutheran center. Following strict COVID protocols over 25 young adults shared reports of the highlights, challenges and achievements during the past year in their

respective countries and churches. They participated in devotions and in capacity building sessions focussing psycho-social on support, disaster preparedness, mainstreaming **HIV&AIDS** Gender Justice, report writing the Sustainable skills, resource Development Goals, mobilization, context analysis and strategic planning for the coming months including World AIDS Day and the 16 Days of Activism against Gender Based Violence.



Thokozani from Eswatini commented, "I have learnt that we can lean on each other as peer educators to spread information and save more people."

Alice from Mozambique put it well, "The LUCSA Peer Educators are known to be activists. They are dynamic, enthusiastic and passionate...with the assistance of the LUCSA HIV&AIDS program we are bringing about change in attitudes, knowledge and behavior... We are part of the new generation that chooses to say, 'I know about HIV&AIDS, I know my status and I can speak freely about prevention...I care about the infected and affected and take responsibility for my own health."

ELCA World Hunger and Lutheran Disaster Response programs continue to support sustainable development projects in Southern Africa to assist companion churches as they work to mitigate the impact of poverty, HIV&AIDS, climate change and the COVID-19 pandemic in the communities they serve.
